A More Sustainable Approach To Drinking Water And Reducing Waste

With growing environmental concerns over the manufacture, transportation, storage and disposal of bottled water and its packaging, PureFree is working with businesses looking for alternative solutions to meet their sustainability and corporate social responsibility targets.

"By switching to tap water, or installing a water filtration system, and using reusable glass bottles, businesses can eliminate the need to buy-in environmentally damaging bottled water in single-use bottles," said Tamara Keniry, founder of PureFree.

In sustainability terms, it is presumed to bring a number of benefits. Tamara said, "Reusable glass bottles eliminate the need to manufacture a new plastic bottle each time; tap water has only 1% of the environmental impact of bottled water and promotes reuse and a reduction in plastics and waste."

Reusable glass bottles only need to be filled as they are needed, there's no need to store and refrigerate a large stock of bottled water. There's no need to remember to order bottled water, no stock control issues and no danger of running out.

Tamara went on to say, "economically, the good news is that many businesses will find that rather than costing more to take this 'greener' option, it will actually cost much less per litre than bought-in bottled water."

By introducing a reusable bottle into the business under a green-environmentally friendly scheme, it provides the opportunity to make a long-term commitment to corporate social responsibility targets.

"Waste is increasing and collectively we need to make a change. By 2050 there will be more plastic in the sea than marine life. If we think about how many bottles a business uses in one year, it makes a huge impact on the environment when it comes to waste," said Tamara.

Organisations can look after their employees, and valued customers, by providing them with a reusable glass bottle, "but they can also protect the environment by cutting out unnecessary waste in the form of plastic bottles," continued Tamara.
